- 5. Participants are required to wear the school uniform unless otherwise instructed to dress in a specific costume.
- 6. All participants must report at 8:00 AM sharp, on both the days.
- 7. The deadline for confirming participation is Tuesday, April 30, 2024.
- 8. Winners will receive trophies and certificates.
- 9. All participants will receive a certificate of participation.
- 10. Participants must refrain from disclosing their school's name to the jury or audience during introductions on stage.
- 11. Exceeding the time limit will result in negative marking.

- 14. The host school will participate as a non-contesting team in all the events.


